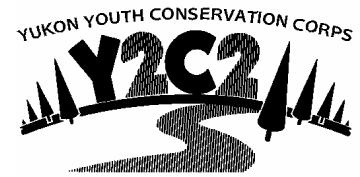

We'd like to partner with you on a summer conservation project in or near your community. The **Yukon Youth Conservation Corps (Y2C2)** program offers you enthusiastic student workers, equipped with basic skills and tools. We handle the hiring, training and administration...you give us a project idea, and then later be available for consultation and supervision during the planning and implementation phases.

Continued this year: the Y2C2 Green Team

As in the past, we can supply you with a crew of four or five workers for up to ten days (longer projects are considered under certain conditions). These crews are equipped with basic transportation, tools and skills. However, if you have a project that requires fewer, but more skilled workers, we can offer you **Green Team Special Projects Workers**. These post-secondary students can assist with more specialized activities in your community such as surveys, field research, and educational campaigns.

How does it work?

You supply the ideas (fill out this form), and later, provide any other necessary support: materials, special equipment and training, etc. The Y2C2 program is intended to help students learn and gain experience, so an educational component to your project is very important. Eligible projects include research, monitoring, community surveys, stream rehabilitation, unauthorized dumpsite cleanup, tree-planting, re-vegetation, heritage conservation, trail development, and education or awareness campaigns with an environmental focus.

When your project is selected:

The Y2C2 Project Selection Committee will review your proposal form. All projects received are ranked according to how well they fit the program criteria. Highest priority is given to feasible projects with significant benefits to the environment, your community and the Y2C2 student workers. (Remember, a strong learning or educational component for the students is very important).

If your project ranks highly we will contact you to get further details, and finalize project planning with you. When the summer rolls around, we expect that someone will be at the project site to direct the students—the best projects are ones in which the sponsor takes an active role and interest.

Frequently Asked Questions About Proposing a Y2C2 Project

Will it cost us anything to have Y2C2 help us on our project?

We cover almost all of the costs associated with a traditional Y2C2 crew of five workers: hiring and training, transportation, camping accommodation (if required) and basic tools. You are responsible for extra costs associated with your project such as construction materials, special tools or transportation. Green Team Special Projects Workers may require some other support from you, depending on the nature of the project.

What is this Green Team all about?

It's not always easy to think of a project that can occupy a full crew of five hard-working students. Now you can propose a project requiring from one to four post-secondary students. These skilled Y2C2 *Green Team Special Projects Workers* can work on short-term intensive projects such as research, surveys, or education.

Can we hire students from our own community to work on our projects?

This program is set up to offer eligible Yukon students a wide variety of career experiences in the outdoor and environmental field. We really encourage applications from communities outside Whitehorse—but we can't guarantee that a youth will work exclusively in their home community. If your community comes up with enough good projects, however, we will base a crew there.

What is expected of us as project sponsors?

The main expectation is that you offer a valuable learning experience for Y2C2 participants. This means you have planned your project well, and are available to guide the youth as they carry out your plans. You don't have to be on the job site with them all the time, but your clear objectives and enthusiasm are important. We also expect you to deliver a valuable education component, and complete a post-project evaluation.

What is meant by "educational component"?

We want students to get the most out their experience with Y2C2—it's more than just a summer job. Ideally, you will provide them with a thorough explanation of the importance of the project; background sessions on natural and human history of the area including contact with elders; and special training in particular skills, if needed.

Can we have Y2C2 workers for a project that lasts the whole summer?

We want the students to get a variety of experiences, so we're mainly looking for projects that last 1-2 weeks. Longer projects may be accommodated however, by having different crews or workers help you at different times in the summer. Call us!

Our project has to be done in May or June. Can Y2C2 help us?

Most of the work by traditional Y2C2 crews is done in July and August. The Green Team option now gives us more flexibility, so short projects may be possible earlier in the season.

Can we get Y2C2 to help us build a recreational trail in our community?

A project must be conservation-related. If you include nature interpretive panels on your trail, or can offer an excellent educational component, your trail project may be ranked more highly by the Selection Committee.
